# FUNDING UPDATE; WE'RE NOT TAKING ANYTHING FOR GRANTED!

A significant proportion of the Gatehouse's income each year comes from grants, and we're still benefitting from major multiple year grants from both Lloyd's Bank Foundation for England & Wales, and the National Lottery Fund RC London and South East Region, which have both played a major part in funding the expansion of our services over recent years.





It might sound simple asking grant awarding bodies for money, but competition for funds has become even more intense over the past few

years, with a number of major grant providers winding up their schemes and more charities seeking a shrinking overall pot of funds. Each year that means we have to apply for around 50 grants, and it's usually a lengthy process, making it hard to plan ahead. None of the income is guaranteed – hence the headline for this article!

To ensure long-term financial sustainability we have developed a diverse income stream that includes continued support from local businesses, community organisations and individuals. You can read more about how to support the Gatehouse throughout this newsletter.

Gifts in Wills now make up around one third of the total donations to UK charities by individuals and that number is forecast to continue increasing. Our financial sustainability is also likely to become more dependent on this sector over the longer term, which is why we, and many other charities are encouraging people to explore this topic.

## **BEHIND THE SCENES**

We often highlight the great work of our volunteers and staff at the Gatehouse, but there is another small group of people working away busily in the background who don't often get a mention, namely our Board of Trustees. As with all charities, the trustees bear ultimate responsibility for the organisation and its effectiveness, including strategy, charity governance, financial control, and all aspects of running the charity. In other words, the role of the trustees is key to the success of the Gatehouse, and essential for the long-term well-being of the organisation as a whole.

Throughout its history the Gatehouse has been blessed with talented and committed trustees. An indication of their dedication is that since the Gatehouse was formally established as a charity thirty four years ago, there have been just 3 chairs and 4 treasurers; the last of the foundation trustees did not retire until 2017. Nevertheless, trustees come and go and we are currently recruiting new trustees, with the aim of widening the skill base, increasing diversity and bringing new vision to the Board.

#### COMMUNITY CENTRE SERVICES UPDATE

The community centre continues to be as busy as ever. Since last summer we've seen nearly 14,000 individual visits to our café serving around 8,000 jacket potatoes and over 1,300 loaves of bread! Clothing and toiletry provision also remains a vital service and in the past year we've distributed nearly 5,000 items of clothing. Donations of these items are always welcomed.

Our workshop programme is going strong. Guests recently enjoyed a fascinating workshop on Rootical Folklore, and coming up are workshops on candle making, pottery, and dog first aid, plus our ever-popular wellbeing workshops return later this year.

Visits from our volunteer hairdresser, podiatrists and optician continue to make a big impact—our guests often say how much something like a simple haircut can lift their spirits.
