COMMUNITY CENTRE UPDATES

The Gatehouse community centre continues to be a busy and welcoming space, with guests accessing hot food and drinks, practical support and opportunities to connect with others. Last year saw over 700 guests in our café, and we continue to see consistently higher attendance, reflecting the ongoing pressures many people in our community are facing.

Alongside regular café sessions we run a range of activities including art, photography, and wellbeing sessions, and one-to-one support. These play an important role reducing isolation and improving confidence and wellbeing for many guests. None of this would be possible without the continued support of our volunteers, staff, trustees and supporters. Their time and generosity help make the Gatehouse the unique and supportive community it is.

BINGO! TWO HOUSEY-HOUSEY VISITS

Over the past year both Oxford MPs have ventured from the House of Commons to visit the Gatehouse. As well as seeing our facilities and mingling with guests we took the opportunity to talk with them about issues affecting homeless individuals.



First to visit was **Layla Moran**, in November 2025. Subsequently Layla has sponsored an Early Day Motion highlighting the work of the Gatehouse, and issues faced by our guests, particularly homeless women. **Annaliese Dodds** visited in May this year, and heard details about LEAF activities (see article on page 4), resulting in productive discussions, identifying areas where she could use her contacts and influence to support us.



LEAVING A GIFT IN YOUR WILL

Gifts in Wills make up a significant, and growing proportion of donations to UK charities by individuals and we have been able to carry out major improvements to our services in recent years thanks to legacies. Our financial sustainability is likely to become even more dependent on this sector over the longer term, which is why we are encouraging people to explore this topic.

There are three good reasons why more and more people are leaving Gifts in their Wills. Unlike normal donations it won't impact on your current finances, you can choose as big or small a sum as you want, and it's a simple process. Please note that with our change to a CIO the name and registered charity number to include in your will are now 'The Gatehouse' and '1216065' respectively. If you've already included us in your Will using the old details then the new CIO should be recognised as a direct replacement. If you're updating your Will it would make sense to change these details.

This year we'll be taking part in the national Remember a Charity Week again, which runs from 7th to 13th September. Keep an eye out for more on our website and social media sites. Your support can make a huge difference to us and our guests over the long term, so please consider leaving the Gatehouse a Gift in your Will.

SUPPORT FROM THE LOCAL COMMUNITY

We'd like to say a massive **THANK YOU** to all of our supporters who have helped us out by volunteering, donating, or raising funds for us. Unfortunately we haven't got room to mention everyone, but here are just a few of the local organisations who have supported Oxford's homeless community through the Gatehouse over the past year. At the Gatehouse our expenditure continues to increase year on year as we widen our range of services and expand our capacity to meet growing demand. This year our costs are forecast to be over **£500,000**.



We rely heavily on local organisations and individuals for support and there are many ways that you can help including donations of money, clothes, food and other items, organising or taking part in fundraising events, and volunteering at our drop-in sessions or as part of a Food Group. We'd particularly like to hear from local businesses and community groups interested in discussing a wider support package.

LEAF CONTINUES TO BLOSSOM...

Our Lived Experience Advisory Forum (LEAF) is a highly successful service that enables individuals with lived experience to have a voice in improving service delivery across Oxfordshire and nationally, whilst offering members new opportunities for personal growth. The last year has been a period of rebuilding and renewed purpose for LEAF, with a major relaunch last year introducing a new two tier membership model and a structured 'Experts by Experience' (EBE) training pathway. The first batch of EBE graduates were awarded certificates following completion of their Induction course, and went on to embark on other courses: Peer mentoring, Restorative Practice, and Return to Education. The next EBE Induction course begins this June.

LEAF members also delivered 38 pieces of work across health, equity, restorative justice, criminal justice, academic research, policy influence, training, and national lived experience development—demonstrating the strength, resilience, and expertise of its members. Alongside this, members participated in creative activities including visits to Blenheim Palace and Weston Super-Mare, and photography and art tours and workshops, with some of their works exhibited in Oxfordshire ArtWeeks.

ALL CHANGE AT THE GATEHOUSE!

Very shortly, and possibly by the time you read this Newsletter the Gatehouse will have undergone a complete transformation! That sounds pretty radical, but what we're talking about here is a change in charity structure from a Charitable Trust (our status since 1991) to a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO). It's a common move by many charities of a similar size to the Gatehouse as a CIO status provides Trustees with a better framework for more effective governance of the charity.

So what's changing?

Well, we've got a brand new registered charity number (1216065), and our official charity name has been shortened to simply 'the Gatehouse', which is what everybody already calls us anyway. That does affect some donations such as Gifts in Wills – see page 3 of this newsletter plus our website (Gifts in Wills and Donate Money pages) for details. Also, we took the opportunity to update our charitable aims, which are now “to relieve poverty and financial hardship among homeless people and other members of the community in need through the provision of a community hub and additional support services.”

Is that it?

Well in practical terms, yes, those are the only changes you're likely to notice. Our staff and volunteers will be the same, our policies, systems, website and social media likewise, and we'll continue to provide the same range of services and activities in the same place and at the same times. So, all change, but in practice no change. Or as our CEO, Sasha East puts it “It's like having extensive remedial work done at the dentist – a long, painful process for us, but hopefully all you'll notice is our gleaming smile.”
